TWIN VALLEY BEHAVIORAL HEALTHCARE IN APPRECIATION OF VOLUNTEERS

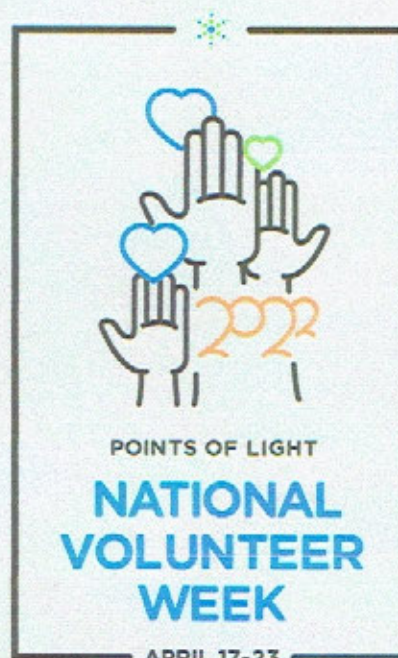
